Eagle Update

*GOSPEL: John 15:26-27,
16:12-15*

Today we celebrate Pentecost Sunday, the coming of the Holy Spirit (or “Advocate”) to the disciples. The Holy Spirit will guide us to truth and will help us live as Jesus called us to live. The Spirit is all around us and speaks truth to us every day. How can we acknowledge and respond to the presence of the Holy Spirit in our lives?

The Holy Spirit can be a difficult concept for young children to understand since we cannot see the Holy Spirit. Wind is often used to describe the Holy Spirit because it can be as soft as a whisper and as strong as a hurricane. We know that the wind can be powerful and move things, and it can be a gentle presence in our lives as well. A pinwheel is a helpful way for the children to understand the power of the wind. When a child blows on a pinwheel, it turns even faster. Have the children decorate their pinwheels with red (a color associated with the Holy Spirit) markers and assemble them. Place the pinwheels outside in the ground or in an open window to remind them of the Holy Spirit this Pentecost Sunday.

Pentecost is this weekend, and I cannot think of a better place than a Catholic School to talk about its importance. Our children have been working their behinds off all year and have really showed their perseverance and determination all year. Their ability to go out into the world and show everyone our faith through actions and words is what Jesus talks about this weekend for Pentecost. Empowering students is a beautiful thing. Hearing their voices sing in mass through the halls, warms my heart and tells me both parents and the school are doing something right. Thank you all for your continued support, prayers, and blessing of letting us all here at AACCS be a part of your lives.
